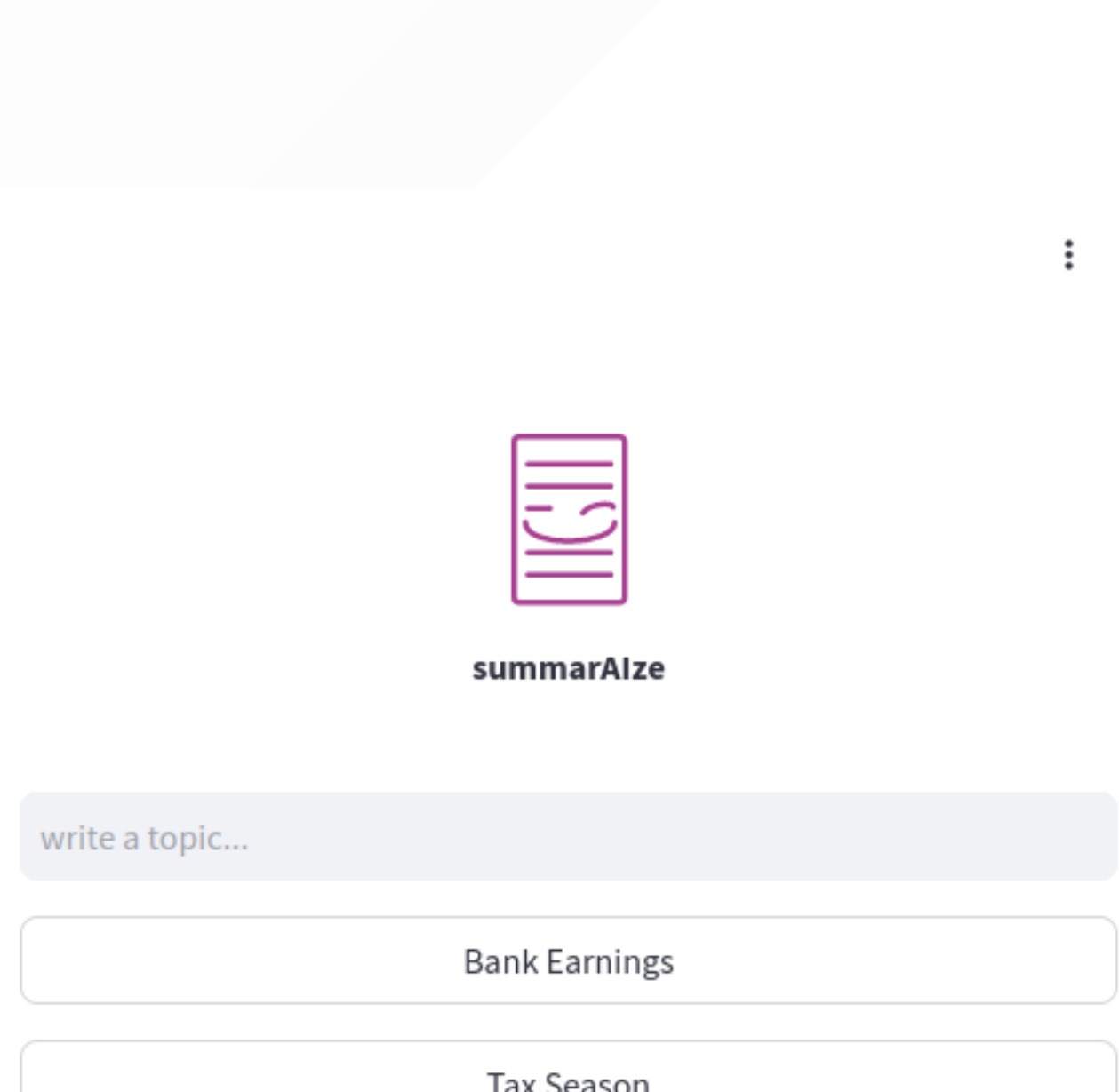

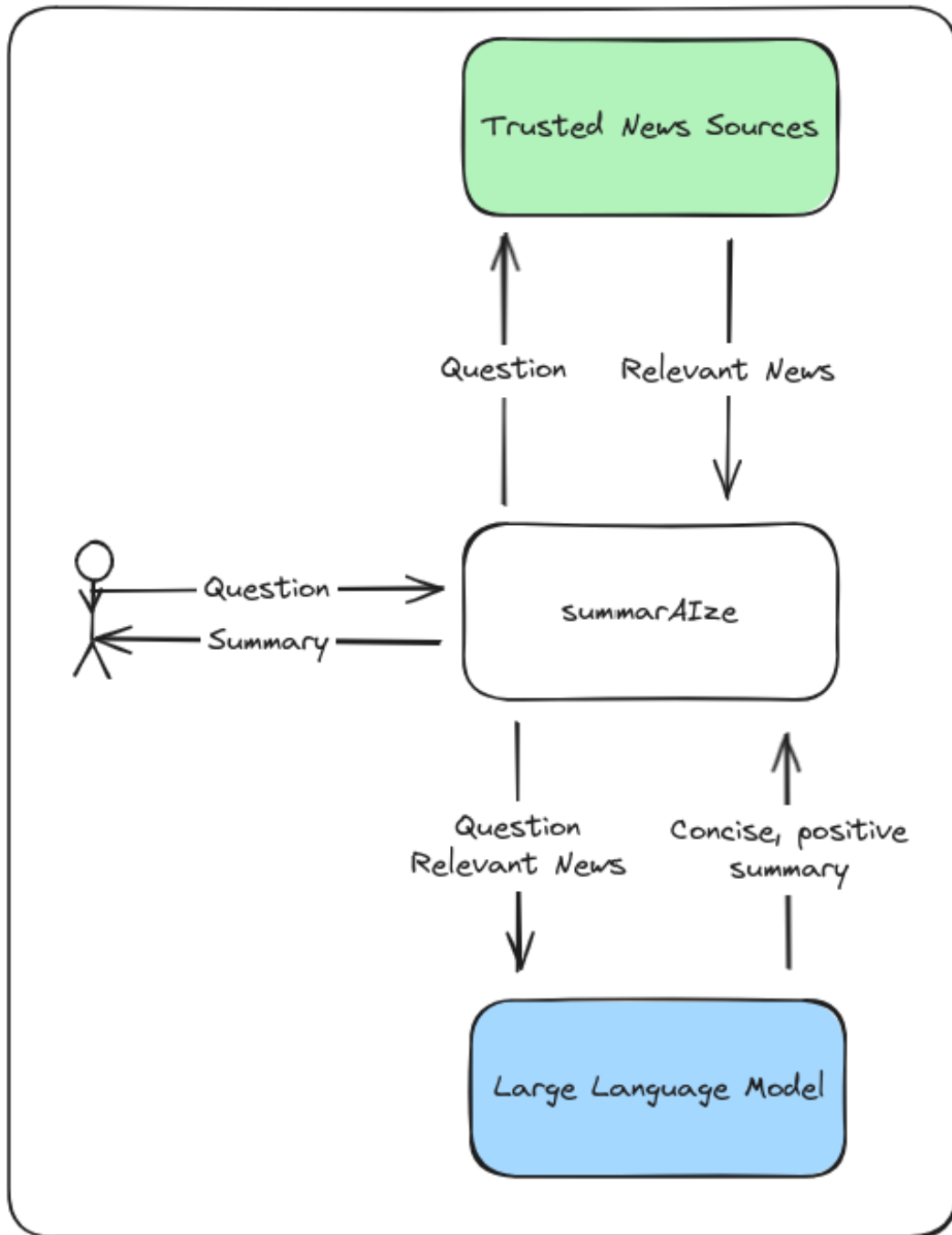

Using the application

1. Enter one topic of interest
2. Get a positive and concise summary made from recent news, without getting overwhelmed (that's it!)





Architecture

Using current news and ensuring reliability

Usage of Large Language Model (LLM) with Retrieval Augmented Generation (RAG)

- User enters a question for news
- SummarAIze queries database of trusted news sources with user question
- Trusted news contents and question are given to LLM
- LLM summarizes news with a positive outlook
- SummarAIze returns positive summarization of news to user



Problem solution

1. Negativity

- summarAlze is designed for a more positive and solution-focused view of news
- Negative and triggering topics can be avoided by user-focused usage
 - Information only given by prompt

2. Overwhelming amount of information

- SummarAlze gives concise summary of topic
- No additional information that overwhelms user
